MISSION OPPORTUNITIES

GREENLEIGH LISTENING PROJECT: We thank God for members of Chester who are already engaged in mission at Greenleigh Mobile Home Park, a community located off Route 1 with 550 mobile homes and 2,000 children.

A small group of mentors from our church have answered God's call for us to invest time with middle and high school students and families to help residents uncover and name their God-given gifts, assets, and dreams. We began an Asset-Based Community Development (ABCD) listening project with six students on November 25. We accompanied students into the homes of their families for interviews on December 9 with a goal of listening to at least 75 neighbors. The students felt proud and empowered as they asked questions such as "If you could do anything to strengthen your neighborhood, what would you do?". Students will compile this data to determine how neighbors want to strengthen their neighborhood, and the talents and abilities that neighbors possess that can be developed for the benefit of the neighborhood.



TITHELY ONLINE GIVING

Please consider e-pay through your bank or signing up for Tithe.ly on the church website (www.chesterumc.org). Most bank-affiliated bill pay services will submit your offering with no processing fee. Simply add Chester United Methodist Church as a payee and set up recurring or one-time payments. **Our Tithe.ly service** also offers a simple way to contribute online! While the Tithe.ly service is free, there is a small processing fee charged by your credit card company or bank (as it is with all credit, debit, and ACH transactions). The fees are deducted from the amount you contribute, or you may choose to cover the fee yourself at the time of the transaction. CUMC pays \$19 per month for text giving; however, transaction fees still apply.

Credit/debit card transaction fees: 2.9% + 0.30 per transaction.

Example: \$100.00 payment = \$96.80 donation deposited after fees\$103.20 payment = \$100.00 donation deposited after fees

ACH/Bank account transaction fees: 1% + 0.30 per transaction. Example: \$100.00 payment = \$98.70 donation after fees
