Next Level Innovations

We are in Phase 1 of the NLI Process. A team of 6 people have begun to work closely with Pastor Clara during this process. Chester UMC has created a congregational breakthrough prayer* that everyone is encouraged to use in their personal prayer life. Many small groups have studied about prayers using the curriculum Ultimate Reliance. Pastor Clara meets regularly with a Clergy Peer Learning Group that helps facilitate growth in personal development, congregational development, and innovation preparation. The laity of the church, in addition to the prayer focus, will learn about evangelism. This phase will culminate with a Ministry Focus Event in the Summer which will be open to the whole church as we come together to discuss where we see God at work in our midst.

LETTER FROM ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL

Paying Forward Tithes and Offerings as a Testament to the Light

COVID-19 has changed daily life for all of us. Anxiety and fear about the future are very normal in a situation like this. Yet, daily I'm amazed by the light that shines through in others with acts of humor, service, selflessness, generosity, simplicity, and above all, through love and grace.

Sadly, this pandemic is not only a public health crisis, it is also an economic crisis. Every person, business, nonprofit, synagogue, mosque, and church is wondering, how can we continue to pay our employees, mortgage/rent and bills through this storm. And the most vulnerable people in our community and world are most at risk of physical and economic suffering. So many people have already lost their jobs and so many small businesses have closed and it is likely that many more will. It is understandable during these times that the ability to meet financial commitments for many will be very difficult.

Yet, many of us are employees in jobs that will continue amid the pandemic or we are on fixed pensions and social security where our income is certain. At a time like this for those of us who are certain of their ncome, I challenge us to pay forward our tithes and offerings a month, two months, or even 3-6 months if possible. I challenge us to pre-pay our barber or hairdresser for the next 3 visits you'll go to when they open again and to buy gift cards from your local businesses struggling to continue as a promise you'll be back when life gets back to normal. I challenge us to utilize these tithes and offerings to be there for our fellow church members during this time and to especially prioritize our assistance to the most vulnerable: the homeless, our seniors, immigrant communities, children, hard working neighbors with limited income in hourly wage jobs, small businesses struggling to pay their bills. I know we are up to the task and I know whatever our financial situation in the days ahead, that Chester UMC will give all of our time, talents and resources given by God. I know we will flood this world in light and love with boldness as we dare to imagine all the new ways we can be God's witnesses during this time of great need.

For the gospel of John Chapter 1 says "What came into being through the Word was life, and the life was the light for all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness doesn't extinguish the light."

Did you know?

95 Theses nailed to the church door on October 31, 1517 by Martin Luther.

Actually, this all started on March 15, 1517 when Pope Leo X announced a special sale of indulgences because they needed money to rebuild St. Peter's basilica. The Pope's sale of indulgences "purchased the forgiveness of all past sins."

In Germany, a Dominican Priest, named Johann Tetzel led the way in promoting the sale of indulgences and erroneously declared that indulgences would cover future sins meaning one price of indulgence agreed upon by a priest could cover all future sins assuring one of a place in heaven. Meaning, based upon an agreed upon price being paid, all future sins were forgiven.

This covering of future sins angered a monk named Martin Luther who struggled with this erroneous but real bartering across the river from his assigned church. After struggling with this real situation and not getting it changed after a few months...that is when Martin Luther posted his 95 Theses.

We don't know the actual timeline from the Pope to the distortion to Germany, but the time frame is from March 15, 1517 until the door posting on October 31, 1517...Reformation Day for the Protestant Movement.
