
CHILDREN'S SUNDAY SCHOOL & CHOIR RETURN!

"If you think you're too small to make an impact, try going to bed with a mosquito." -Anita Roddick

If you blink, you're going to miss it. The leaves are going to change. One moment we'll notice the sun setting across the sky giving cotton candy hues mixed with purple; the next, we will see the dance of reds, golds, and bright orange in the breeze that gets cooler and cooler by the evening. For the next ten minutes, the two of us shared stories about Youth Mission trips, a Christmas musical, and family ties. On one particular mission trip, he recalled not wanting to scape paint. He put his tools down and went over to sit down on a porch swing. The swing promptly gave way and a board gently impacted him on his head. He took it as a sign God wanted him back to work.

I marveled as he shared stories and ways his life had been shaped. I couldn't believe God had made such an impact (even with a broken board on a porch swing). You see, I was only at that church as youth minister for a little over one year. If you had asked me if I had made any great leaps for the Kingdom of God that would later influence community policing by a senior officer - I'd tell you you were crazy. But our God is an amazing God who works through us.

Each of us makes an impact. No matter how many prayers you offer for others, no matter how much comfort and care you provide, and no matter how much time, financial support, and love you give, you impact the world around you. Let's makes sure it's a positive impact that gives beauty and praise. Let's reflect the Creator's paintbrush. Make an impact. After all, it's what Jesus would do.

CHAD'S CHALLENGES

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." John 3:16

Dear Chester UMC Family,

Because I became your associate pastor in July 2020 in the middle of COVID, I feel like it's my first year. There are so many ministries; I'm just beginning to experience all that our church has to offer. I'm just beginning to get to know everyone. As Karen Carpenter sang, "we've only just begun."

I'd like to share with you three of my ministry priorities going forward.

First, I am prioritizing pastoral and congregational care, working closely with Pastor Nathan, our staff, the Visitation Team, Stephen Ministers, and other groups. I encourage you to participate in our care ministries, whether as part of a team or through informal calls and notes, prayers, and encouraging words. We, the church, are called to care for one another. Every need and every individual matters.

Second, I am prioritizing missions, and third, diversity. John 3:16 is one of the most well-known scripture verses because it speaks of our salvation through God's love in God's Son Jesus Christ. However, not everyone realizes the shocking implications of the revelation that God so loved the world. That means everyone. God loves every individual and every group of people, every race and ethnic group, people of every nation, every gender, every social class, and so on and so on.

Therefore, I am overjoyed that we have broad and overwhelming support in our church for our Greenleigh mission with Latinx (Hispanic) peoples as one of CUMC's missional priorities.

I am also amazed by the humble and committed disciples who, for the past 15 months, have engaged in challenging, though highly important, conversations about race relations and racial reconciliation. We study the Bible, and we are now reading Who Will Be a Witness: Igniting Activism for God's Justice, Love, and Deliverance, by Drew G. I. Hart. I understand that some of you may have concerns about these conversations on race or reservations about this book choice. That's ok. I encourage open conversation and mutual listening. We grow in God's love for the world when we study scripture, pray, and have holy conversations with people who have had life experiences that are different from our own. We grow in God's love for everyone when we seek to live like Jesus and when we yield to the Holy Spirit.

God so loved the world that God gave Jesus for you, for me, and for all peoples! God's expansive love inspires me to be passionate about pastoral and congregational care and our shared missional priorities. God's inclusive love inspires me to be a minister of love, justice, and reconciliation alongside all of you, my co-workers in the gospel, my siblings in Christ.

I give thanks to God that we have been "coming back" to worship and small groups (online, phone, and in-person), church picnics, giving, service, and more.

STEPHEN MINISTRY MOMENT— Is Attending Church Really Worth It?

For the past 18 months, we have adjusted to a different way of life. Instead of going shopping or to work, school, and church, many are staying home and ordering groceries, working or going to school online, and attending church online. There is no doubt that technology has allowed us to accomplish much within our own homes. And, if we're honest with ourselves it can be downright pleasant eating breakfast and drinking coffee while still in our pajamas listening to Pastor Nathan deliver his sermon via our iPad or iPhone.

If we can so easily and comfortably "attend church" online, is it really worth physically attending church? Can't we get everything we need from online church? While there is nothing wrong with watching a church service online, we need to actually attend church when possible. The purpose of church is so much more than just listening and learning. According to Dr. Kenneth C. Haugk, the Church, the body of Christ, is uniquely able to fulfill four deep needs we all have.

- **Spirituality:** to know and be known by God, to feel loved and accepted by God, to worship God and demonstrate love for God a need shared by all, even those who have no religious affiliation
- Community: to know and be known by other people seeking spirituality together, to feel loved and accepted by others, strengthening and supporting one another
- Care: to have people who will help bear life's burdens on behalf of the spiritual community, to receive care and support without judgment or criticism
- Service: to make a difference in the lives of others through the ministry of a caring spiritual community

To be <u>in</u> church among other believers makes it possible to fulfill these deep spiritual needs and to help others be fulfilled. As a community of believers, congregations – including ours – are well positioned to meet these needs and to help people address them. One of the ways we do so is through Stephen Ministry. COMMUNITY CHRISTMAS SHOEBOX PROJECT

Again this year, CUMC will serve the local **Greenleigh Mobile Home Community** by providing Christmas gift boxes to approximately 180 children in need. The age groups we will focus on are boys and girls ages 2-3, 4-6, 7-9, and 10-12. Age-appropriate small toys can be put in each box. Examples are dolls, balls, stuffed animals, puzzles, yoyos, bubbles, cars, etc. Also hair accessories, brush, comb, toothbrush, ChapStick, toiletries, school supplies, socks, and jewelry may be added. DO NOT INCLUDE CANDY, GUM, OR TOY WEAPONS.

- 1. GET a shoebox to pack. Wrap top and bottom separately with gift wrap.
- 2. After preparing your gift box, return it to church LABELED GIRL OR BOY AND AGE GROUP, either 2-3, 4-6, 7-9, or 10-12. Large rubber bands will be available to secure the lid. Please do not seal box.

MEDIA UPGRADE

On Sunday, September 19, we announced a new fundraising campaign as we seek to replace our existing sound systems and add video equipment in both the Sanctuary and Davis Fellowship Hall. We are excited about the improvements and expanded possibilities this will bring for our church and our community. Our new video equipment will greatly improve our online worship services. New sound equipment will remedy a slew of technical issues that haunt us week after week. Because our volunteer sound technicians are so skilled, most folks have no idea how many nightmares we face and gremlins we battle week after week at the sound board. Our existing systems have served us well for 13+ years, well past the typical life expectancy, but their effective lifetime has come to an end.

When the Bridge Band resumed rehearsals recently, even more issues revealed themselves. We were in a mad scramble to put band-aids on the sound board just to be able to execute the service effectively. And even then, on the first Sunday back at The Bridge, we were picking up FM radio signals that were invading our speakers! The fun never ends (he types with deep sarcasm!)

If you were here on September 19, then you also heard the loud gasp that occurred as we announced the sticker price for this media upgrade. The bottom line is right around \$93,000+ for sound and video for both worship spaces. I'll give you a moment to process that information. For what it's worth, another company quoted a price of \$120,000 for JUST the Sanctuary. I have spent countless hours working with multiple companies to secure the best possible price. We have worked to find savings and tweak as much as possible without sacrificing quality and integrity. When we worship, we are called to give our best to God, and while not necessarily glamorous, the sound system is a part of that experience.

We are blessed because we are going to be able to use memorial funds to cover approximately half of this project! Praise God! Donations made in memory of the saints who have gone on before us have been blessed by their ancestors for this purpose.


