COMMUNITY CHRISTMAS SHOEBOX PROJECT

Again this year, CUMC will serve the local **Greenleigh Mobile Home Community** by providing Christmas gift boxes to approximately 180 children in need. The age groups are boys and girls ages 2-3, 4-6, 7-9, and 10-12. Age-appropriate small toys can be put in each box. Examples are dolls, balls, stuffed animals, puzzles, yoyos, bubbles, cars, etc. Also hair



accessories, brush, comb, toothbrush, ChapStick, toiletries, school supplies, socks, and jewelry may be added. DO NOT INCLUDE CANDY, GUM, OR TOY WEAPONS.

HOW TO DO IT:

1. GET a shoebox to pack. Wrap top and bottom separately with gift wrap.
2. After preparing your gift box, return it to church LABELED GIRL OR BOY AND AGE GROUP, either 2-3, 4-6, 7-9, or 10-12. Large rubber bands will be available to secure the lid. <u>Please do not seal box</u>.

THE GREAT DIVIDE

"If Facebook was a country, it would have the largest population of any nation on Earth."

-Social Media Revolution 2022

In an era already filled with division and polemical politics, I hate to say it but there is something big dividing us right now. It isn't what we believe, how we vote, or where we stand but how we are doing faith. We are in the Digital Divide. Half of us are non-digital natives (those 35ish and

older). The larger group (those younger than 35) have never known a world without computers, the internet, and social media. Just as none of us can imagine a world without automobiles, the youngest and largest part of our population can't imagine a Church (or a world) without seeing it online.

This isn't new. It didn't happen because of the Pandemic. And yes, it requires a dramatic change in our way of understanding connection, small groups, fellowship, discipleship, and worship. Over 50% of people on earth now are on Social Media. Video is the primary way to communicate, advertise, and market. The way we used to preach, outreach, invite, share, and friend has all changed.

I'm so glad we're back in person for our worship, small groups, and events - don't get me wrong. But we can't deny the dramatic lessons God has taught us through this crisis. People want to connect to God through an online faith. There will always be a worship service directed to an online-only audience, and yes this is not the same as a live-streamed service.

People want to connect with one another through social media. Over 90% of people are influenced by online reviews and conversations about where they invest their time and talents and how they develop spiritually. Instagram has "influencers" whose sole job is the impact decisions people make; their average income is above \$76k. Our world has changed. Three people are hired every minute on LinkedIn. Snapchat, Whatsapp, TikTok, WeChat: the list of apps for grouping chats, conversations, conversions, and contemplations just keeps growing. People spend an average of 2 ½ hours a day on social media. It's where we go to be entertained, educated, and inspired.

Yes, there is a great divide. And Church, God is calling us to pay attention. There is a whole digital generation out there looking for meaning and purpose through faith. The question is will we be the church who plugs in and engages, or will we be content that we finally have gotten back to what works for us?



RICHMOND SLAVE TRAIL WALK/RIDE

8:30 AM on Thursday, November 11. The members of the Who Will Be a Witness? small groups invite you to join them on Richmond Slave Trail's Walk/Ride. This three-hour excursion will allow the participants to experience the history of slave trade in Richmond Virginia from 1775 to 1865. This path was recreated by the City of Richmond in 2011. We will meet in the church parking lot. The church van can accommodate eight passengers. Additional participants can carpool. The walk/ride commences at the Manchester Docks (1200 Brander Street, Richmond, VA 23224).

This historic location is where the enslaved Africans were unloaded for auction in Richmond or were sent to other locations throughout the state. Walkers will travel along a wooded trail, while riders will take a parallel road. Hikers will then climb an embankment and then descend a paved path along the flood wall. Both groups will proceed across the Manchester Bridge. We will reassemble at the monument to Henry Box Brown. At this point, everyone will ride to the remaining stops that are in the city's street portion of the trail.
