THE PARTICULAR NATURE OF GOD'S LOVE by Pastor Nathan Decker

"God loves each one of us as if there were only one of us." -St. Augustine of Hippo

I am overwhelmed by God's love. God's love knows no bounds. Christ hanging on the cross does not say "Father forgive some of them," but instead offers us a universal love of welcome, acceptance, transformation, and salvation. Jesus died for all. Jesus offers hope and resurrection to all. Jesus loves everyone. But scandalously so, Jesus loves everyone as if they were individually one. As much as each of us needs, Christ's sacrifice supplies.

In preparing for the Easter Season, I am struck by how unique and particular God's universal love is expressed in the resurrection narratives. Jesus doesn't appear before the whole world in some viral video, nor does he gather large crowds in some hyped up super reveal. Our Resurrected Lord meets each one as if they were the only one. One, two, or three and no more than eleven (the Twelve minus Judas) seems to be his desired impact number. Jesus chooses to love particularly.

In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus speaks with two Marys. In Mark's Gospel, this scene is repeated as well as indication that he met with the, now, Eleven. Luke's Gospel adds Joanna and the couple walking to Emmaus. The Gospel of John gets real specific: Mary, Peter, John, and Thomas all get a conversation. It is only in Christ's ascension that he gathers larger numbers.

By example, Jesus is teaching us The Way. God's universal love is always expressed in particular ways. Why else would there be one tribe called 'chosen,' Twelve Apostles, and other instances where God blessed two or three in unique ways? In our ministries at Chester UMC, as hard as it may be, we must follow Christ's example of particular love. Churches that strive to reach "all people" find themselves grasping at sand. In the beginning we catch a lot, but we are incapable of holding on in the end. I firmly believe God is leading us to express God's love in targeted, focused, relationship-driven ministries.

The best example of this is in our new (accidental and Spirit-led) ministry of blessing Schools. Last year, I followed Principal Matt Strittmatter of Elizabeth Davis Middle School as "Principal for a Day." That led to our Christmas blessing of the teachers and staff. Immediately three people came to me and said, "but what about <insert your favorite school's name here>?!?!" So we continued with a Valentine blessing at Curtis Elementary and Marguerite Christian Elementary. Guess what happened? More schools were named by more individuals. I suddenly began to worry that in our striving to reach all we were diluting our ability to bond with any one.

And this is where I paused in prayer and looked to Jesus. We can be the church who goes around transactionally blessing schools until we've covered the whole county and the tri-cities. OR, we can follow Christ's way of particular love. Love seeks relationally blessing. Love desires not to drop off and leave, but to invest and stay. We need to focus on love to be particular. That means choosing two or three schools as our mission. And I know that won't make everyone happy.

I'm in prayer, and I'm listening for God's Spirit to help us discern. Through Holy Conversation, our congregation will hear clearly where God is leading us to share that universal love particularly and quite possibly peculiarly in a unique way. After all, it's what Jesus would do.

CHAD'S CHALLENGES

"Go to the people of all nations and make them my disciples." Matt. 28:19 (CEV)

Time for a discipleship challenge! Did you know that the Greek word ethnos in Matthew 28:19 which is commonly translated as "nations" can also be translated as "ethnic groups" or "peoples"? It's no surprise since the Greek word ethnos sounds like the English word "ethnic." It's no surprise (hopefully!) that Jesus told us to make disciples of all peoples, regardless of ethnicity or national origin, or age, or any category invented by human beings Without any qualification whatsoever, Jesus tells us, "Go to all peoples and make them my disciples." Can I get an "Amen"?

Chester UMC is living this out! It starts with our vision, which includes "Embrace Diversity" and "Positively Impact Community." In our Spanish-language ministries, we are working alongside women of Greenleigh to build community through family-friendly, culturally relevant gatherings and improvement of living conditions. Also, the Holy Spirit is guiding us to a small group of families who we are calling "discipulos potenciales" or potential disciples. These are families who have been consistently engaged in relationship with us and who we hope will become a small group for prayer, Bible study, and worship in Spanish. Here's your first Spanish lesson: "Amen" in Spanish is "Amén." It has an accent mark and is pronounced only slightly different from the English word. Let's try it! Can I get an "Amén"? I said that ethnos means all people, regardless of age! I thank God for our faithful people of every generation in our church! For example, our Visitation Team continues to bless our homebound or "shut-ins" and remind them that they are important and are not forgotten. Can I get an Amen?

Thanks to the Spirit working through Carrie Coyner and many other teachers and assistants, our children's Sunday school is alive and kicking! We are making the children Jesus' disciples! I encourage all families to bring your children, your grandchildren, your neighbors' children, and children in the community to "Come and see" so that one day they will say for themselves, "we've found the Christ!" (John 1:41). Speaking of which, seventeen of our youth will be confirmed by the church in public worship and will profess, "We no longer believe just because of what you said. We have now heard for ourselves. We know that Jesus really is the Savior of the world." (John 4:42) Now, can somebody please give me an "Amen"?

And don't stop with an "Amen." How is Jesus calling you to make disciples? Of which persons or peoples? Who is the Spirit leading you to?

You can choose to meet in person, or if you prefer, just speak on the telephone. Whatever you talk about is confidential, between you and your Stephen Minister. Minister only. Here are a few real life comments from those who have a Stephen Minister.



"I can feel God's presence when my Stephen Minister is here".

"There is no judgement. She walks beside me. She doesn't try to fix me, she just listens".

"My weekly visits with her are an anchor in my life, something I can rely on when everything else is so uncertain. She is a steady reminder of God's presence, helping me to know that I am never alone".

"It is a safe, confidential relationship where I can totally share my heart, and she just listens".

"My Stephen Minister shows me the face of Christ. God brought me exactly what I needed".

"I needed to know that there was just one person in the world who knew the good, bad and ugly about me, and still cared for me. Experiencing this through my Stephen Minister is a tangible expression of God's love. It is changing my life".

"My friends support me, but I also needed someone objective, someone I can count on every week to encourage me on this roller coaster of life. There is genuine acceptance, encouragement to confess my feelings, and finally, help to accept forgiveness. The consistency of our relationship is crucial in helping me to cope".

"When I am with my Stephen Minister, I feel Jesus with me. The love of God in his eyes is there while we talk and pray. It is such a comfort and a feeling of peace".

Would you like to have your blood pressure checked? She can take it. (She can also check your home machine with a manual reading if you have concerns that your sphygmomanometer is not working properly.) Maybe you had a visit with your doctor, and you don't quite understand something that was said or a medication that was prescribed. Our Parish Nurse has up-to-date information that she can share with you. Also, if you develop a headache while you are here or maybe indigestion from the doughnuts, she has a variety of over-the-counter medications available. If you are diabetic and have a hypoglycemic episode, she has glucose tablets and gel on hand. (Screening blood sugars will not be done.) Besides being prepared for First Aid, Nurse Webb is also CPR certified. All information given and visits with the Parish Nurse are kept confidential.

UMCOR HYGIENE KITS FOR CONFERENCE

The United Methodist Committee on Relief operates two relief depots, one in Salt Lake City and the Sager Brown Depot in Baldwin, Louisiana. 
