GROWING BY GETTING SMALL

There is something powerful about finding your tribe. As human beings it is instinctual to group together. Whether it is that first friend we play tag with at the playground, our first bestie who sits next to us at lunch in school, or the group we consistently meet with to watch a game: we need a tribe. It offers protection, identity, a safe place to explore ideas and actions. A small group provides the most important opportunities to be challenged, transformed, and experience growth.

That's how Jesus did it. He started with some fishermen. "Follow me." Soon, Peter, Andrew, James, and John became the inner circle. Then he kept going. "Follow me." There were the Twelve. I capitalize it because the number came to mean more than just how many, but an identity of those first ones Jesus not only called but sent out. "Follow me." There were small groups of women doing all sorts of things supporting Christ's ministry. "Follow me." Jesus called and sent out, two-by-two, 70 disciples to spread the good news. "Follow me." Even in the feeding of the 5,000, Jesus had them sit down in small groups.

Too many times we as church focus on the big events, but if we want to follow Jesus we also have to get small. We have to create and be a part of small groups, tribes of love. Unlike the tribes of the world that compete and bicker and exclude, our small groups will have a "follow me" approach. A small group can meet weekly, every other week, or monthly as long as they meet regularly. Small groups care for us, give us identity, and create safe places to study, doubt, grow, and experience God. I want to challenge each of us to be a part of a small group.

Our small groups at Chester UMC focus on the three "S's." Study, Service, Social. Each group majors in one and minors in the other two. Some groups will be like our Sunday Small Groups and focus on studying how to be a better disciple of Jesus. Others may be like some of our weekday groups that are more social or service in nature. All of them represent tribes of God's love in the world, challenging, transforming, and growing our church.

When Christ walked upon the earth, he didn't just have massive crowds that showed up once a week to hear good preaching. He empowered them to gather in small groups to care for one another and change the world around them. Let's "follow" Jesus by finding our tribe, the place where we belong at Chester UMC. After all, it's what Jesus would do...

"Day after day they met in the temple continuing with one mind, and breaking bread in various private homes. They were eating their meals together with joy and generous hearts, praising God continually, and having favor with all the people. And the Lord kept adding to their number daily those who were being saved."

BEHIND THE SCENES OF STEPHEN MINISTRY

Have you ever wondered how our Stephen Ministers got their training? Do they just read a book? Watch a video? Then after that, bam!, they are Stephen Ministers?! The answer to that would be a resounding "No." Our Stephen Ministers receive 50(!) hours of Care Ministry training, provided by the national organization, right here at CUMC. It is lead by our four Stephen Leaders: Steve Osborne, Beth Stewart, Vince D'Agostino, and Beth Powner, who have each attended a 25 hour Stephen Leader Course in addition to their initial 50 hour training. It is an engaging and energizing experience that features a mixture of pre-class reading, devotions, presentations, discussions, skill practice, and videos. Role playing plays a big part in their training as they begin to feel what it's like to minister to a person that is hurting. The training is intense, with weekly meetings and a few Saturdays, starting in September and going through to early December. The classes equip Stephen Ministers with relational and caring skills that they can apply to all aspects of life. The training also helps to deepen their faith as the Holy Spirit fashions them into a Christ-centered caregiver. Stephen Leaders are working hard now to prepare for the next training session starting September 7.

PARISH NURSE

Our Parish Nurse is Cindy Webb, RN, BSN is available for consultation most Sundays from 9:00-10:45 AM in Office 111 and by phone (804-748-5314) to help with medical questions or to obtain medical equipment from the church. Would you like to have your blood pressure checked? She can take it. (She can also check your home machine with a manual reading if you have concerns that your sphygmomanometer is not working properly.) Maybe you had a visit with your doctor and you don't quite understand something that was said or a medication that was prescribed. Our Parish Nurse has upto-date information that she can share with you. Also, if you develop a headache while you are here or maybe indigestion from the doughnuts, she has a variety of over-the-counter medications available. If you are diabetic and have a hypoglycemic episode, she has glucose tablets and gel on hand. (Screening blood sugars will not be done.) Besides being prepared for First Aid, Nurse Webb is also CPR certified. All information given and visits with the Parish Nurse are kept confidential.

If you've owned investments such as stocks, bonds, mutual funds, or real estate for over a year and they've appreciated in value (appreciation is a must), did you know you can donate them to Chester UMC and avoid paying capital gain taxes on them? You can also take a charitable income tax deduction for the full fair market value of your donation.

We'd like to give you a little something to think about as you plan your giving. If you set aside \$1,000 in cash with plans to donate it to the church and you have stocks you invested in over a year ago... if those stocks have appreciated in value you can donate \$1,000 worth of those stocks to Chester UMC, avoid paying capital gain on the donated

stocks, and reduce your taxable income. Then what do you do with the \$1,000 you've set aside? Use it to buy more stock and in essence, return your portfolio to the level it was at before you made your donation.

HISTORY MOMENT

I have fond memories of a wonderful lady in our church, Helen Partin, who was very active and well known for her pound cakes. I looked for that recipe in our United Methodist Women's cookbooks...but, alas, it is not there!

Her husband, Claggett, was the Church Treasurer from 1940 - 1971 and took great pride in doing a meticulous job. They also donated a pew in the 1973 sanctuary. And, as with others who donated pews at that time, they always sat in "their" pew and if someone sat there first, they were asked to move down and make room. After all, it was "their" pew!

At Josh's Birthday celebration we were asked to bring a dessert. So, I brought Helen's Perfect Peach Crisp. Due to the many people who asked for the recipe, I am paying tribute to Helen and including it below:

Helen Partin's Perfect Peach Crisp

Bake at 350 degrees

Butter an 8" x 8" Pyrex dish. This recipe will generously serve 4 people.

3 c. canned sliced peaches - drained (I used peaches in light syrup) juice of 1 lemon 1 c. sifted flour

1/4 14

½ tsp. salt

1 c. granulated sugar

1 beaten egg

6 TBSP melted butter

³/₄ tsp. cinnamon (plus cinnamon on top)

Place fruit on the bottom and sprinkle with lemon juice. Sift dry ingredients together. Add beaten egg. Toss mixture with fork until crumbly. Layer over fruit and then dust additional cinnamon on top. Drizzle butter over dish. The butter makes the top crunchy. [If you cover it to serve later, the top will be soft.]

Bake at 350 for about one hour.

**For apple: add ½ tsp. ground cloves when sifting dry ingredients.

To serve 10-12 people: use a 10" x 15" Pyrex dish; (3) 29 oz. cans fruit in light syrup; double the dry ingredients, egg and butter. I did not add a second lemon. I believe that was meant to cut the extra sugar when using peaches in heavy syrup. I also cooked for an additional 15 minutes at 425 degrees.
