


# **Mission Sunday 2022**

# **CONSPICUOUS LOVE**

"This is how everyone will know that you are my disciples, when you love each other." -John 13:35

Every now and then I get to attend one of those great coming of age ceremonies that our churches are blessed to be a part – an Eagle Scout Ceremony. Being an Eagle Scout is the highest rank in the BSA program. It is an amazing achievement for anyone. But at this particular ceremony, a word caught my ear. "Remember that your actions are now a little more conspicuous..."



Scouts stand out. Girl Scouts, Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts – when they put on that uniform it marks them as a target for judgment, envy, and eyes that seek negativity. It is almost as if the whole world is just waiting for someone in that uniform to screw up so that there can be a media frenzy, lawsuits, and policy changes. I understand this, because Christ taught us to understand this as Christians.

As a Christian, I am not of this world. I love this world. I love my country. But I recognize that I am, as one theologian put it, a "resident alien." I am a citizen of God's realm, I reside here. I am not of this world, I am alien. The moment I was baptized, I was marked, spiritually circumcised, and uniformed to be conspicuous in love, particular in behavior, and radical in hospitality. God claimed me as a part of the Body of Christ. God put me to work to bring the world fully into the Kingdom of God, to be a part of the salvation of the cosmos. I am a child of God, and that means there is an expectation that there is a difference.

A problem we have in today's church is that we equate being a good citizen of this world with being a good citizen of God's Kingdom. That works one way, but not necessarily both. Being a Christian should make us more thoughtful, more deliberate, and perhaps more intentional in our being a citizen of this world. But being a good citizen does not equate to behaving like Jesus.

In the early church, Christians (and their children) were baptized naked. As they came out of the water the first thing that the church did was robe them in white. It wasn't to say we were better than anyone else. We are not bragging about divine brownie points. It was our uniform that said we were now conspicuous. Jesus prayed that we would be "known by our love for one another."

If you are like me, the only time you see the church in the headlines and in the new television shows is when we are stereotyped into backwards, brainwashed buffoons power hungry on using political means to make everyone believe the way we do. While this is conspicuous and even outlandish, it doesn't seem like we are wearing the uniform God told us to put on in our Baptism.

Our passion is to live life through the passion of Christ. Our strength comes from living in our weaknesses. Our power resides in lowering ourselves to be with the powerless. Our salvation and eternal life comes from denying ourselves, taking up our cross, and following Jesus even to the point of death. The attention we should get as a people of faith should be about our love of the unlovable, our welcome of the outcast, and our honest confession that we are broken people offering a wounded Savior to heal a broken world. That kind of love draws attention. It did in Jesus day, and I know it still does today. Live a conspicuous life, after all, it's what Jesus would do.

"My kingdom doesn't originate from this world. If it did, my guards would fight so that I wouldn't have been arrested by the Jewish leaders. My kingdom isn't from here."

## **CHAD'S CHALLENGES**

A Call to Pray for Our Latino (Hispanic) Ministry

"When a foreigner, who is not of your people Israel, comes from a distant land because of your name ... then hear in heaven your dwelling place, and do according to all that the foreigner calls to you, so that all the peoples of the earth may know your name and revere you" I Kings 8:41, 43.

Our church has a long history of positively impacting our community. That history has included our ongoing care for the Greenleigh mobile home community where most of the residents are Latino (Hispanic).



We are in the beginning phases of planting a new Latino faith community. We want to invite them to be members of the body of Christ with us. Back in June, I began a Latina women's Bible study. We currently meet on 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesdays of every month. I am also working with an emerging group of Latino children and youth (mostly boys, a few girls) that revolves around soccer and faith, or what I call "soccer church."

Many, though certainly not all, Latinos in the Chester area are immigrants, or what English language Bibles (depending on the translation) calls "strangers," "foreigners," "resident aliens," or "sojourners." In his prayer dedicating the temple in 1 Kings 8, Solomon provides a model for our church. He prays for the foreigner. Solomon's prayer stresses the care that the community of faith shows for the stranger. Solomon prays that all peoples would experience God's love and serve God and the community alongside the Israelites.

Likewise, Jesus' church prays for and cares for the needs of strangers—whether they are immigrants or are simply different from the majority members of the local church. Jesus' church wants all people to experience God's love in Christ, to share in salvation, and to grow as disciples.

I call you to pray for our church's Latino (Hispanic) ministry. Pray for this ministry at home daily. I call your small group at CUMC to pray for this ministry every time you get together. Here are some suggestions:

Pray for ...

- The Latina women's small group Bible study.
- Our Latino "soccer church" with Latino children, youth, and families.
- The Greenleigh and broader Latino community in the Chester area.
- CUMC disciples who are participating in our church's Latino ministry.
- Pastor Chad's pastoral leadership and boldness in planting a new Latino faith community that will be members of the body of Christ with us.

Thank you for your prayers! May the peace of Christ be with you.

# HARVEST MOON ENTERTAINMENT NIGHT



## **HISTORY MOMENT**

Many of you may not know that Chester UMC sponsored a Cuban family in 1962 when people were fleeing Castro and coming to the United States. The Lopez family applied a year before they were allowed to leave the country and arrived in Miami.

"Our family which includes Felix Lopez, his wife Maria, daughter Eneida, 16 years, and son Gilberto, 13 years, arrived in Richmond with a large group of Cubans. Our adopted family did not speak English so Wesley and Joyce Soto along with Margaret Bennett (who also spoke Spanish) helped with communications. The family lived in the upstairs apartment of Eddie and Pat Goyne's home. A job was found for Felix at Miller Manufacturing Company but it was hard for him. Besides the language



problem, he was not used to the heavy physical work. He had been in sales in Cuba. Maria did babysitting and small jobs. The kids went to school. Gilberto helped Mac Phillips and me teach the children's choir a Christmas carol that they performed in church in Spanish that year. The church bought Gilberto a bicycle and he got a job delivering newspapers. After a year, the family decided to move to New Jersey where there was a large Cuban community across the river from New York City. There were more job opportunities without the language barriers. After finishing high school, Eneida worked for Pan American Airlines. Through her work, the whole family was able to travel and visit many countries. Gilberto went on to college and became an art teacher in Bloomfield, New Jersey. He also has made a name for himself as an artist and photographer. He has had exhibitions of his works, been published in magazines, and has won numerous prizes and honors as an outstanding Cuban artist." Joyce Soto, 1995
