I know everyone is looking for their Offering Envelopes. I am too! The envelopes were ordered in November from the company we have used for at least 10 years, maybe more. I confirmed they received the order, and I was looking for them to be received before the end of last year.

In my communications with the company, I was never told that they are severely behind on orders. After calling last week begging for our envelopes, I was told that due to personnel issues, printing press breakdowns with parts not being available, and difficulty in getting paper, that it might be March before our order is processed. What?!?!?!?!? That's not acceptable and why didn't you mention this the last three times I talked to you?

I know those that use the envelopes need them. I have contacted four other companies to get quotes and "turnaround times" from them. In the meantime, I am making envelopes for anyone who marked on their 2023 Pledge Card that they wanted them. They will be in the Atrium and each set will be bundled together with a rubber band. They will have your name, address, and giving number on them. We are recycling blank and unused envelopes until we can get printed ones made.
