

#### 1891 Chester Methodist Episcopal Church South

Under the ministry of the Rev. J. W. Stiff (1888-91) there was an unusual growth. Brother Stiff recorded on September 19, 1891: "We have in process of erection at Chester a very handsome church which we hope to occupy during the winter and have ready for dedication by the spring or early summer." The new church was valued at \$3,300. It was built on the site of the old church between Winfree Street and the Atlantic Coast Line Railroad.

The Church was located in a large, wooded area on Winfree Street with ample room to park horses and buggies. Members would remove the bridle from their horse, attach a feed bag to his head or place hay on the ground for feeding. There were preaching services once a month. The rest of the time the services were conducted by Laymen of the Church.

There was a front entrance, double doors in the tower with a steeple and belfry, and inside were four walls with beautiful stained-glass windows. The stained-glass windows were made of smaller geometrically cut designs in pure colors of red, blue, green, yellow and purple. The center aisle of seats in the Church were most sought after in the winter as the sanctuary was heated by two floor registers--one in each aisle. Sunday school classes met behind the pulpit next to Winfree Street in the choir area and the primary children met in the vestibule. Later the center portion of the sanctuary was divided by curtains. The Men's Bible Class erected a tent in a grove of trees to the left and had a private classroom. In the winter they built a makeshift shelter and added a stove for warmth.
