

1927 Chester Methodist Church

The lots for the 1927 church were purchased in 1925. An existing building on Percival Street (once a school) was purchased next to the adjoining lots and converted into a parsonage. Landon L. ("Hap") Perdue helped draw the plans with architect Julian Fox for the sanctuary, Sunday school rooms, and basement fellowship hall. Construction began in 1927.. The cost to build the church was \$27,000. Upon completion of the new 1927 Sanctuary, the building was occupied, and the Rev. J. W. Stiff preached the first sermon February 12, 1928, at which time he donated the pulpit Bible and hymnal. The Williams Aid Society refinished the old pews and equipped the Sunday School department. A new Estey pipe organ was installed as a gift from Walter N. Perdue (in memory of his brother, Sam) and the Williams Aid Society. The stained-glass windows were given in honor/memory of loved ones. The bell from the 1891 church on Percival Street was placed on the roof of the Sunday school wing.

In 1939-40, the Methodist denominations merged and became known as The Methodist Church. In 1949, Chester Methodist Church was made a single station with an assigned pastor that preached each Sunday. In 1968, the Methodists and the Evangelical United Brethren united under the title The United Methodist Church.


