

What is "Second Mile" Giving?

In Mathew 5:41, Jesus suggests that when we are asked to go one mile, we go a second mile. Applying this to how we give, our first mile of giving is our tithes and offerings and our "second mile" is when we give and designate how the gift is to be used. 1973 Chester United Methodist Church

"While still worshiping in the 1927 church, many in the congregation were renewed in spirit during the first Lay Witness Mission and the fast-growing congregation benefited. 'How Great Thou Art' became our theme hymn. Folding chairs were placed in the aisles to seat the overflowing attendance. Others were seated downstairs where loudspeakers brought the sounds, but not the sights, of the service. Finally in 1972, the new Church, complete with a carillon (given by the Hatcher sisters), was a marvelous reality. Charles Bartholomew was Pastor." *Eleanore Roberts, Church Secretary for 27 years*

Reverend Charles Bartholomew led the congregation processing from the old to the new sanctuary as all sang "How Great Thou Art."

"The sanctuary [Colonial building] is entered through the oval shaped portico into the narthex, which has a slate floor. On the right is a coat room and, on the left, a bride's room. Inside the sanctuary with plaster walls and acoustical ceiling, the walk down the center aisle leads to the chancel area which has the altar in the center and the choir on each side. It has a seating capacity of approximately 500 with an unfinished balcony which will allow for future expansion of an additional 175 seats.

The interior also follows the Colonial theme in its pews, chancel furnishings and windows. All of the sashes are glazed with a Blenko mouth blown glass [from Italy]. The pulpit is elevated on a pedestal and set forward of the choir rail, giving the pastor a commanding view of his congregation. The basic structure is 108 feet by 56 feet, rectangular, one-story. There is a total of 8,340 square feet and 267,000 cubic feet. It is wall bearing with steel roof trusses and slab on grade.

The exterior of the church is of handmade, sand finished brick with the typical Williamsburg muntins in wood sash and the backband trim on the window and door openings. The copper covered spire towers to 114 feet and can be seen within a radius of approximately one quarter of a mile of the surrounding area. The spire contains a carillon, which chimes the hour and plays selected pieces, as well as a bell which came from the [Winfree Street] church constructed in 1891. This is often rung by hand by means of a pull rope in the narthex." *Source: Virginia Record, November 1973, pp. 29 and 99*

The rose window, given by Ruth Moore, that was displayed in the front of the sanctuary above the choir loft in the 1927 sanctuary, was moved and now resides in the atrium where guests and members are welcomed. The 1927 sanctuary was divided into classrooms and remains an integral part of our ministry. The new building was dedicated August 12, 1973.

ABOUT THE SHOW

Throughout a career that spanned four decades, Oscar Hammerstein II used the theatre to promote human understanding. He continually tackled themes of racism and cultural bias, changing the very course of musical theatre in the process. All Kinds of People is a musical revue (running time: 50 minutes) that addresses the dangers of prejudice, the importance of tolerance and the empowerment of self-esteem. These issues are considered through such songs as "Ol' Man River" from Hammerstein's 1927 masterpiece Show Boat, "You've Got To Be Carefully Taught" from his Pulitzer Prize winning South Pacific, and many others from such beloved musicals as The King and I, Flower Drum Song, The Sound of Music and Carousel.
