<u>What is "Second Mile" Giving?</u> In Mathew 5:41, Jesus suggests that when we are asked to go one mile, we go a second mile. Applying this to how we give, our first mile of giving is our tithes and offerings and our "second mile" is when we give and designate how the gift is to be used. First mile funds are used for local operating expenses and the support of ministries at local, conference, and world levels. An example of second mile giving is when we designate on a check or envelope that a gift is for our HVAC project or we give during a special offering for the HVAC project. Other examples of second mile giving are gifts designated for a specific mission trip, UMCOR, VBS, our 150th Anniversary, etc. Another <u>key distinction</u> between first mile and second mile gifts is that second mile gifts <u>are not counted</u> as part of our tithes or annual pledges. As you are blessed, we encourage you to bless others through second mile gifts while keeping in mind, designated (second mile) gifts are gifts of generosity above and beyond your tithes and pledges.
