## **GROWING BY GETTING SMALL**

"Because true belonging only happens when we present our authentic, imperfect selves to the world, our sense of belonging can never be greater than our level of self -acceptance." -Brene Brown

There is something powerful about finding your tribe. As human beings it is instinctual to group together. Whether it is that first friend we play tag with at the playground, our first bestie who sits next to us at lunch in school, or the group we consistently meet with to watch a game: we need a tribe. It offers protection, identity, and a safe place to explore ideas and actions. A small group provides the most important opportunities to be challenged, transformed, and experience growth.

That's how Jesus did it. He started with some fishermen. "Follow me." Soon Peter, Andrew, James, and John became the inner circle. Then he kept going. "Follow me." There was The Twelve. I capitalize it because the number came to mean more than just how many, but an identity of those first ones Jesus not only called but sent



out. "Follow me." There were small groups of women doing all sorts of things supporting Christ's ministry. "Follow me." Jesus called and sent out, two by two, 70 disciples to spread the good news. "Follow me." Even in the feeding of the 5,000 Jesus had them sit down in small groups.

Too many times we as a church focus on the big events, but if we want to *follow* Jesus we also have to get small. We have to create and be a part of small groups, tribes of love. Unlike the tribes of the world that compete and bicker and exclude, our small groups will have a "follow me" approach. A small group can meet weekly, every other week, or monthly as long as they meet regularly. Small groups care for us, give us identity, and create safe places to study, doubt, grow, and experience God. I want to challenge each of us to be a part of a small group. (I know some of you are already and I'm so proud!)

Our small groups at Chester UMC focus on the three "S's," **Study, Service, Social.** Each group majors in one and minors in the other two. Some groups will be like our Sunday Small Groups and focus on studying how to be a better disciple of Jesus. Others may be like some of our weekday groups that are more social or service in nature: playing instruments, working out, doing a mission project, or just having coffee and prayer. All of them represent tribes of God's love in the world, challenging, transforming, and growing our church.

When Christ walked upon the earth, he didn't just have massive crowds that showed up once a week to hear good preaching. He empowered them to gather in small groups to care for one another and change the world around them. Let's "follow" Jesus by finding our tribe, the place where we belong at Chester UMC. After all, it's what Jesus would do...

"Day after day they met in the temple continuing with one mind, and breaking bread in various private homes. They were eating their meals together with joy and generous hearts, praising God continually, and having favor with all the people. And the Lord kept adding to their number daily those who were being saved."

-Acts 2:46-47

## **CHAD'S CHALLENGES**

"Go, then, to all peoples everywhere and make them my disciples: baptize them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and teach them to obey everything I have commanded you. And I will be with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:19-20 Good News Translation)

Go. Don't just stay where you are. Don't get too comfortable. Some people come to us, but most don't. Jesus had the divine wisdom and the human experience to know that you must go out into the community. That is, leave your home and go, talk, and play with your neighbors. Leave your neighborhood. Leave your church (well, just for a time, then



come back next Sunday!). Go to the park, sports fields, stores, coffee shops – anywhere people are. Go out into the community. If you physically or medically can't leave home, then pick up the phone, get on social media, or just reach out to whoever you can. Get to know them and their families. Ask questions and show interest in them. Have fun. Find ways to show them you care. That's easy. Our church excels at social events and caring for each other. Just extend that to others.

Go. To all peoples. Jesus spent most of his time in a few communities – Galilee, Jerusalem, etc. Yet he encountered Jews and Gentiles (different ethnic groups), wealthy and poor, settled people and sojourners. Who are the peoples in the neighborhood of our church? Who are the peoples in a 3- or 6-mile radius of our church? With whom is God calling us to spend our time?

To take an example, one group are children and families. They come from many different neighborhoods, social classes, ethnic groups, cultures, and languages. Leave and go to them. Build relationships. Go with your church to Play N Share. Volunteer at a community event, like the Chesterfield County Fair. Invite them to come with you to Family Game Night or to ESL (English as a Second Language) or some other ministry. Transform existing ministries (like the church picnic or the youth group—you can still celebrate your traditions, just invite others to join in!). How might we rethink our ministries so that they are outward-focused, outreach-focused, and hospitable to the unchurched?

There are other groups. Go to the peoples. Go with a friend or a group from church. Follow the nudging of the Holy Spirit. Get creative with ministries. Be outward-focused, community-focused.

Make disciples. As you get to know people, they will probably start to ask you questions about yourself, your church, or your faith. Take that opportunity. Even if they don't ask, as they see you truly care about them, you will earn credibility. Then, share your faith story. Share something about how God has been there for you and loves you, or how or how you've experienced the Holy Spirit. Tell them a story—a story about Jesus from the Gospels, or your story of your walk with Jesus.

Go. Don't just stay where you are. Don't get too comfortable. Go to all peoples. Share Jesus. Make disciples of Jesus.

## STEPHEN MINISTRY MUSINGS

#### What is Stephen Ministry?

Stephen Ministry happens when one specially trained Christian, the Stephen Minister, helps another person through a difficult time. It is one on one care, and everything shared with a Stephen Minister is completely confidential. Our goal as Stephen Ministers is to carry out Christ's commandment in John 15:12 to "Love one another as I have loved you," and to do it in a practical way that brings healing and comfort to those who are troubled. When you have a Stephen Minister, you have someone who will walk with you for a season through your troubles. This may take a month, a year, or longer. Your Stephen Minister is there to support you, pray for you, and care for you. He or she will not judge you or tell you what to do. They will listen and be a safe place where you can share your burdens. A Stephen Minister will help anyone who asks, regardless of church membership.



#### What kind of troubles might a Stephen Minister help with?

There are many reasons a person seeks a Stephen Minister. Someone struggling with a relationship with a parent, a child, a co-worker, or even God, may benefit from the support of a Stephen Minister. A person who has lost their job, their health, or a loved one may seek the help of a Stephen Minister. A caregiver who is feeling overwhelmed may want a Stephen Minister. The reasons are as varied as there are people in this church.

We all have burdens that drive us to seek the risen Savior. Your Stephen Minister cannot take your troubles away, but they can walk beside you as you seek the One who can.



## STEWARDSHIP MINUTE

#### How to Pay Your Annual Tithes in a Lump Sum

Raise your hand if you use/used IRAs to save money without having to pay federal taxes on it! Each year, members and friends of CUMC find themselves in the category of investors who are required to take "required minimum".

distributions" (RMD). If this is you or someone you know, please keep reading.

RMDs may place some of you in a higher tax bracket and federal tax is to be paid on each "required minimum distribution." But guess what?!?! Your distribution can be taken as a "qualified charitable distribution" (QCD) directly from your IRA to Chester UMC and you will not pay federal tax on the distribution. If you were 72 years old by 12/31/22 or are now at least 73 years old and retired, you have QCDs as an option, but remember, a QCD is already a tax-free strategy, therefore, it cannot be included in your tax return as a gift. This is a great way to pay your annual tithes (first mile giving) all at one time.

## 2023 ANNUAL CONFERENCE

#### Update provided by Erik Johnston

Hi Chester UMC! Claudia Nagy, Steve Osborne, Erik Johnston, Evan Moody, Pastor Nathan, Pastor Chad, and many of the retired clergy in our congregation attended the Virginia Annual Conference in Roanoke June 15-17. Our church is connected to other United Methodist Churches through the Living Waters District and through the larger Conference in Virginia. For Claudia, Steve and myself it was our first time attending the Conference.

Every church in the Virginia Annual Conference sends lay delegates equal to the number of appointed clergy (that's why Chester UMC gets two!). Claudia was also sent as our District's Lay representative. Evan was a part of the youth delegation. Over 1,800 UMC delegates worshipped and decided policy together on the floor of the convention center. We are the biggest Annual Conference in the United States. It was inspiring to worship with so many fellow believers!

The Conference provides support for missions in Virginia and across the world, equips our clergy and lay leaders to bring people to faith and service, supports Campus Ministries and our Methodist Universities and Colleges, and so much more. Perhaps most importantly Conference provides an opportunity for us to get together, learn from each other, and encourage each other.

We also get together to debate policy and create rules...we are still human after all and need to be organized as a church. Bishop Sue Haupert-Johnson set a tone of how we should see Christ in each other and debate respectfully. The Bishop is an inspiring leader who is focused on the future. She clearly sees the strength of the United Methodist church and communicates our mandate to be out in the world taking Christ to the people!

This is the second time since Covid began that we have been together in person at Annual Conference. It was a time to acknowledge the challenges and pain the church has experienced as some congregations have left the United Methodist Church through a process called disaffiliation. The United Methodist Church now stands ready for a rebirth and rejuvenation as over 90% of our churches are remaining United Methodist!

Many of the leaders' messages contained themes familiar to us at CUMC, as they are shared by our leadership. One message in particular spoke to us: we are in a moment where we should not circle the wagons and only share Christ with those like us, but we are to go outside the walls of our church and serve God's people. We, like Ezekiel, have seen the dry bones. We have been the dry bones as we experienced isolation, mental health challenges, a divided world and so much more...but God is ready to blow new life into us. We are a big tent church and can become even bigger!

We left the Annual Conference encouraged in our faith as we felt the Holy Spirit moving in this moment. We recall meeting a young new clergy member who shared that he'd been discouraged from his career choice due to the division and disagreements in our society. He then told us he believes we are called for times such as these to preach the Good News and to transform the world by renewing our minds to God's way.

We can choose to let the world define us, to focus on those churches that have left, and to become discouraged at the division in the world and the hardness all around. We can choose to circle the wagons and only be in the presence of those with whom we agree. Or we can choose to be reborn, to be transformed, and to let God's spirit blow life into these dry bones. We saw and felt that spirit blowing though our Annual Conference, and I see Christ's spirit blowing through Chester United Methodist Church. This is especially evident as we get outside our campus and take Christ to Chester and the world. We are **all** called for a time such as this to experience the abundant life and encouragement of being called to serve together. Let's all lean in to support our pastors, staff, and lay leaders at this important moment in the life of our church and the church at large.

Check out the Fresh Start Sunday School Class for study, fellowship and service.

- Through September 3—NOOMA. The name NOOMA is an English phonetic spelling of the Greek word pneuma, which is commonly translated to "spirit" or "breath." Pneumatology refers to the study of spiritual beings, particularly the interactions between humans and God. NOOMA is a series, by popular pastor Rob Bell, that includes short films, scripture and discussion of issues that we really care about.
- Beginning September 10—What does Jesus want to know about us? Jesus was fond of asking questions, many of which cut right to the heart of what it means to be human. Why are you terrified? What do you live for? Who do you say that I am? In *Questions Jesus Asked*, author Magrey deVega explores six of the most provocative questions Jesus posed to others and guides us in answering them for ourselves. Asking these questions takes courage. Not only do they reveal what Jesus really cares about, they open a window into our hearts.
