

DENYING SELF TO GROW THE KINGDOM

-Albert Einstein

"You matter." The words dripped like honey to the child hiding in the corner crying. He had been in the sanctuary just moments before the incident. Lying down in the pew, coloring in one of the books passed out by the ushers to keep little hands occupied, he had been happy. But as he stretched out is arms in a yawn, the way children do, not paying attention to who or what they might bump, his hand knocked the hymnal ajar causing it to fall out of its holder.



The thud was louder than the squeal that occasionally came from the sound system. The thud was louder than the whispers of Sister Bettina who always feigned innocence about gossip. The thud was louder than the soloist who at that moment was singing his heart out as if he was on Broadway or in some Opera house. The thud interrupted everything.

The preacher stood to see from where it came from. The organist hit wrong notes and rested her fingers and feet to silence as she realized the long-practiced music was no longer the center of attention. Everyone turned to see the wild tuft of hair, two little eyes, and one little nose peeking above the next to the last pew.

"Well, I never..." Sister Bettina began a long monologue of proper parenting, disciplines, and punishments she'd deal out, peppered with several cordial notes of "bless his heart." The preacher sat back down, but the interruption had clearly disturbed her. The collective scowl from the organist and the soloist was beyond compare. The child had placed a solid staccato where it should not have been.

The sum total forced the shamed child out of the sanctuary and into the corner. That's where the old gentleman found him, crying. Placing his arm on the boy's shoulder, he simply said, "You matter. No matter what looks people give, no matter what they say or do, know that you matter more." The boy's ears didn't understand the meaning, but his heart received the message. He mattered to God. The old man's words were not minced. "God loves you. You matter."

As we begin Lent this year, a season of giving up self and focusing on God, we might also pay attention to where God's focus has led us: Children. The older I get, the more I am tempted to want worship and church to feed me and focus on me. I forget that I'm called to give up self so Christ's Kingdom will grow among the children. As a welcoming church, we're called to deny ourselves and offer hospitality to the mother who's desperately trying to quiet the baby and to the child who fidgets, whispers, and can't seem to keep still. We thank God for the interruptions no matter how large or small because they are blessed interruptions.

At Chester UMC, God is calling us to be the children's church. We've hired Juliana as our Director of Christian Formation to lead this effort. We continue to partner with our Chester UMC Preschool to share faith and education with tiny ones. We've put rocking chairs in the back for moms and dads with babies. Our nursery staff are some of the most loving people I know. We're following Christ when he speaks to us concerning the littlest among us. We're giving up self to grow the Kingdom. After all, it's what Jesus would do.


MUSIC NOTES



STEPHEN MINISTRY MUSINGS

Did you know that 2025 will be the 50th Anniversary of the Stephen Ministry program?! Exciting things are happening now at the home office and around the world. It has always been their mission to "to organize, equip, and supervise Stephen Ministers, to provide high-quality, one-to-one, Christ-centered care to people in the congregation and the community experiencing life difficulties." But nothing ever stays the same. The organization, under the leadership of Ken Haugk since 1975, has developed a new mission:

"To equip All People to care and relate with greater excellence."

Church Stephen Ministry will continue, but now the organization is reaching out to even more groups such as hospitals, financial groups, police and fire departments, and prisons to build a more caring world. They want to be the caring presence of Jesus throughout the world, and will be doing this with their new book, *The Gift of Empathy, Helping Others Feel Valued, Cared for, and Understood.* What is Empathy? "True Empathy only occurs when we make a personal connection, when we directly interact with someone by listening, asking questions to encourage more sharing, and by being present as they tell their story…we care about what they are going through."

And how do we at CUMC fit into this vision? This book is being pilot tested all over the world. Churches and other groups have been asked to read it, have small group discussions, and answer questions to help to edit the book. Andy and Eileen Steck, two of our Stephen Ministers, will be presenting this book over the course of three months to our current group of Stephen Ministers. They will provide feedback to help make it easy to read the book and apply the concepts. It is already being used by teachers, pastors and church staff, emergency responders, medical professionals and more.

Can you imagine a world where everyone has empathy? It is the new vision of the Stephen Ministry, and we are proud to have even a small part in this. Our hope is to share our experience with other small groups in our church and community once the final draft is published.



Join us starting February 18 for a new study.



FOOD PANTRY

Did you know Chester UMC hosts a distributing food pantry for Chesterfield Colonial Heights Alliance for Social Ministry (CCHASM)? In a typical week we provide two CCHASM-referred families with a cart full of non-perishable food and a modest Kroger gift card to use for perishable items. We also serve walk-in clients who have not yet enrolled with CCHASM. Food pantry clients may schedule one appointment per month, and their grocery order is tailored to the size of their household. As a special blessing to our clients, the Jean Craig Fellowship ladies recently assembled and donated birthday cake kits. The kits contain everything needed to bake and decorate a cake, along with some other goodies like balloons and a card.

A fabulous team of faithful volunteers keeps our food pantry running smoothly. John Radford monitors inventory and shops frequently to replenish the shelves. He always goes the extra mile, even delivering groceries to a client who can no longer drive. Several dedicated volunteers take turns packing and distributing food each week.

The food pantry is funded entirely by donations. If you'd like to contribute, we especially appreciate monetary donations (make check to Chester UMC, *Food Pantry* on memo line). UMCOR KITS FOR CONFERENCE



The United Methodist Committee on Relief operates two relief depots, one in Salt Lake City and the Sager Brown Depot in Baldwin, Louisiana. For the past several years CUMC and the UMW have collected materials for and assembled hygiene kits to be sent to Sager Brown. UMCOR keeps the kits on hand for when disaster strikes. Due to tornadoes and flooding in the Southeast and war in Eastern Europe and the Near East, there is an urgent need to restock their inventory of hygiene kits. LENTEN STUDY

The Gospel Truth: The Easter Story from the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John

This four-week study, led by Marg Kutz, will take a fresh look at the resurrection stories from the four gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. How are the four accounts alike and how are they different? What does it mean "Jesus rose from the dead" and what is "the resurrection of the body"? What is the difference between the resurrection and the ascension? What other questions do you have about the resurrection of Jesus? There is no study book except the Bible and there are no assignments.


